


### Metro Drug

In 2014, The Manitowoc County Metro Drug Unit continued to be staffed as a **multi-jurisdictional task force** utilizing the resources committed by the **Manitowoc County Sheriff, Manitowoc Police Department** and **Two Rivers Police Department**. The personnel committed by each jurisdiction remained consistent and there are no anticipated changes in 2015. Moving forward the task force has the potential for another successful year as the investigators become more experienced. The resources committed by each agency should be maintained throughout 2015. The additional resources provided by the Manitowoc County Sheriff and Manitowoc Police Department in 2013 made a significant impact on the outcome of several complex drug investigations.


In 2013, the Manitowoc County Metro Drug Unit had a very successful year based on narcotic seizure amounts in numerous drug trafficking investigations. Records indicate that **seizures for heroin, cocaine and marijuana plants were the largest on record**. In 2014, the task force directed its efforts towards targets that were the most concerning drug threats to the community. It is becoming more difficult for investigators to be proactive due to the increasing volume of drug related information requiring investigators to direct their efforts toward significant drug abuse situations.

Overall, about **36%** of the cases initiated and investigated by the task force were related to **heroin**. Approximately **28%** of cases involved a wide variety of **prescription medications**, but most involve narcotic, synthetic opiate-type pain medications. The recent change from marijuana and cocaine related investigations reflect the new threats. Now approximately **76% of the task force caseload**

relates to heroin, prescription medication and methamphetamine substances.



In 2014, the task force utilized the *Manitowoc County Special Operations Squad (SWAT)* for **search warrants**. The reason for this increased utilization is due to the dangerous nature and unexpected behavior of individuals abusing heroin, large variations in prescription medication, and especially methamphetamine. Additionally, the quantities normally possessed and contained within residences are very small compared to quantities of marijuana. These small quantities can be easily destroyed or secreted within the body which requires quicker control and isolation of individuals and areas during a search warrant. A total of **25 drug search warrants were executed in 2014**. Of those, the SOS team was utilized 19 times. Investigators and SOS personnel evaluate and discuss each search warrant scenario and determine the need for assistance and justification for additional personnel and tactical presence.




The task force initiated and investigated approximately **90 cases**. This would also involve a total of approximately **165 controlled purchases of narcotics**.

One of the most significant and important aspects of narcotics investigation is identifying and either disrupting or dismantling a drug trafficking organizations (DTOs). In Manitowoc County we identify a DTO as a group (5-15 individuals) involved in a multi-level distribution organization which purchases large quantities of narcotics outside of this area. The organization then has multiple subjects in/around the Manitowoc area distributing the drugs to mid-level dealers who distribute to the street level dealers that are very active in Manitowoc County. On the basis of our local size and the local definition of a DTO in 2014 the task force was able to either disrupt or dismantle **9 DTOs**. Some of these investigations involved lengthy conspiracy type investigations which expose the criminal activity and involve numerous witnesses and suspects. These investigations have a significant impact on the supply of narcotics in the area.

**Over 550 intelligence entries were made in 2014** by investigators within the task force involving drug activity in Manitowoc County. Investigators continue to develop reliable sources of information at the “street level” to maintain the highest level of familiarity with current trends and threats to the community. **Prescription medication diversion and heroin abuse continue to be the highest priority for the task force.** Prescription monitoring programs and access to prescription medication disposal sites are areas that could have a positive impact on this health threat. Education and awareness are key areas of emphasis within the task force. In 2014, the task force worked closely with a local group to bring a “**Heroin Summit/Initiative**” to the community. This event was very well attended and will be motivation for additional community awareness events. The task force has been proactive in participating in these focus groups, and community support for the task force remains high.

The Manitowoc County Metro Drug Unit continues to direct and oversee the **Manitowoc County Drug Disposal Program**. In 2014, nearly 1,400 pounds of controlled and non-controlled substances were collected. Below is a chart which illustrates results from 2014 and previous years.
