## JUNIOR FAIR DAIRY CATTLE

1. Entry Day – **Wednesday, August 24**. Animals must be in place by 2pm in the Dairy Cattle Barn.
2. Judging Day – **Friday, August 26**, starting with the cow classes at 9am, Ice Center **Showmanship judging on Thursday following Open Class Dairy**, Ice Center
3. Release Day – **Sunday, August 28**, starting at 5:30pm.
4. If valid registration papers are not presented to the Dairy Superintendent by 5pm on Wednesday (entry day), the registered animal will not be allowed to be shown.
5. Animals exhibited in Open Class, cannot be shown in Junior Fair, this includes showmanship.
6. Stalls will be assigned by the Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Superintendent. All exhibitors must show with the youth organization whose leader approved the entry. Junior Fair exhibitors must keep dairy cattle with the Junior Fair exhibit.
7. Each exhibitor must care for and feed the animal or make arrangements to have the animal fed and cared for.
8. Junior Fair dairy exhibitors may enter six (6) animals, but may show a maximum of four (4) animals. Each exhibitor must pay a manure fee per animal, with a maximum of four (4) animals. **Exhibitors may enter two (2) animals per lot number, but only one (1) animal per lot number may be exhibited.**
9. Black and White Holstein cattle entered in registered classes must be shown in the registered class in which they were entered. The Registered Holstein Ancestry (RHA) must be 87% or higher to show in the registered Black and White Holstein classes.
10. In the Ayrshire, Guernsey, Brown Swiss, Jersey, and Red and White Holstein breeds, grade and purebreds will be shown together.
11. Animals shown in the Red and White Holstein classes must have a red and white haircoat.
12. Champion Ribbons and/or trophies will not be awarded to animals unless there is competition, but the animal is eligible for consideration for champion.
13. All dairy animals exhibited must be the exhibitors own Junior Fair Dairy project.
14. Sketch blanks or pictures are required for all dairy cattle and must be signed by the exhibitor's leader and/or advisor.
15. ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A PERMANENT ID NUMBER, EAR TAG OR TATTOO TO BE SHOWN AT FAIR. TAGS ARE AVAILABLE FROM DHIA, VETERINARIANS, AI TECHNICIANS, ETC.
16. HEALTH REGULATIONS: See WI County, District, and State Fairs 2016 Animal Health Rules and Regulations located on the Web site. Any required health certificates/copies must remain in the Expo office during the fair.
17. It is suggested that at least thirty (30) days prior to the Manitowoc County Fair, all dairy animals receive a 9-way and a Pasturella vaccination. The 9-way vaccine may be administered as either a modified live (one injection needed) or a killed vaccine (initial injection followed two-four weeks later with a booster). Modified live vaccines should be used on non-pregnant animals only. Please consult your veterinarian.
18. State regulations prohibit the sale of milk for human consumption that is produced other than in proper facilities. The dairy cattle exhibitors have voted that the proceeds from the sale of milk produced at the fair be used to improve dairy facilities. Thank you for your cooperation!
19. Exhibitors are responsible for any damages due to contaminated milk at the Milk Parlor during the fair.
20. Finish or touch up clipping will be allowed in designated areas by exhibitors, family members and/or leaders. It is recommended that body clipping be done prior to the fair.
21. Dairy exhibitors must show their own Junior Fair Dairy animals. For selection of Junior, Senior, and Grand Champion, a Junior Fair Exhibitor must show the animal. The same animal must be used in all heats and finals. If assistance is needed, it will be provided by the ring help.
22. Unruly animals will be tied up on the side of the show ring.
23. **JUNIOR FAIR EXHIBITORS MUST WEAR THEIR EXHIBITOR NUMBERS WHILE SHOWING. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE RULES MAY RESULT IN PREMIUM FORFEITURE, DISQUALIFICATION, AND/OR BEING PLACED LAST IN THE CLASS! Rule violations will be dealt with as soon as possible by the dairy superintendent and the 4-H dairy committee.**

Any exhibitor who exhibits in Dept 1 (ATCP 160.15) is eligible. **Exhibitor must show their own Junior Fair Dairy project animal.** You must make an entry on your registration blank to participate in Showmanship. Showmanship is judged in order by numeric lot numbers. The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) scorecard will be followed.

A Supreme Champion Showperson and a Reserve Supreme Champion Showperson will be selected from the above showmanship age Blue Ribbon winners. Ribbon Award Only.

## CLASS J: BRED AND OWNED (RIBBON AWARD ONLY)

1. All clubs are automatically entered.
2. Premium money will be awarded for the organizations placing First, Second, and Third.
3. Clubs cannot use decorations wider than 11-12 inch boards that are furnished.
4. Display booths are not permitted in the Junior Fair Dairy Exhibits.
5. A traveling herdsmanship trophy will be awarded to the First Place winner in each group. If an organization is awarded the trophy for three (3) consecutive years, the organization is permanently awarded the trophy.

### MANITOWOC COUNTY FAIR PRODUCTION AWARDS

1. The Manitowoc County Fair will award four (4) plaques to the exhibitor(s) of the highest production record at the Manitowoc County Fair. The plaques will be sponsored for the following classes: Three Year Old, Four Year Old, Aged, and Dry Cow.
2. Plaques will be presented to the exhibitor showing the cow with the highest combined butterfat and protein record (CFP) in each of the four (4) classes.
3. Plaque sponsors include: Eastern WI DHIC, Manitowoc IBA, Meadow Brook Dairy Farms, and Sunnyside Dairy Farm.
4. To be eligible to compete for the production trophy, the exhibitor must meet the following requirements:
  - a. Animal must be entered through an approved youth organization (4-H, FFA, Jr. Holstein Association, Girl/Boy Scouts) project at the Manitowoc County Fair.
  - b. Only Official DHIA or DHIR records will be accepted.
  - c. The DHIA record must be signed by the DHIA field technician supervising the record, the youth organization leader and the youth exhibitor.
  - d. The last completed 305 day record is required and must have completed the 305 day record sometime after **August 1, 2015**. Awards will be presented based on actual 305 day records. 3X records will not be discounted.
  - e. Entries, production records, and their certification are to be sent to the Dairy Agent, Scott Gunderson, by August 1. All entries must be signed. Entries submitted after this date will not be accepted.
  - f. The winner(s) will be announced and the trophies presented during the Cow Classes of the Junior Fair judging on Friday morning.
5. Awards cannot be received more than once for the same record.

## HERD BUILDER AWARD

The First Place entry in this contest receives a registered heifer calf courtesy of GreenStone Farm Credit Services. Any Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Exhibitor age 12-15 as of **January 1, 2016**, may enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest, and enthusiasm in their dairy project and the number of animals exhibited. Contact your dairy leader or the Manitowoc County UW-Extension office for applications. Entries are due by **August 1**. Please send your application to Scott Gunderson, Manitowoc County UW-Extension Dairy Agent.

## OUTSTANDING DAIRY CATTLE YOUTH EXHIBITOR

The First Place entry in this contest receives a \$500 scholarship to be used toward a post-secondary education in production agriculture. CP Feeds, LLC., provides financial support for this program. Any Junior Fair Dairy Cattle Exhibitor age 16-19 as of **January 1, 2016**, is eligible to enter. Scoring is based on the exhibitor's knowledge, interest, and enthusiasm in their dairy project. Plans for the future are also considered. Contact your dairy leader or the Manitowoc County UW-Extension office for applications. Entries are due by **August 1**. Please send your application to Scott Gunderson, Manitowoc County UW-Extension Dairy Agent.

## FARM BUREAU KIDDIE SHOWMANSHIP

The Farm Bureau Young Farmers again will be sponsoring a Kiddie Showmanship Show at the Manitowoc County Fair. The show will be on Sunday, **August 28, 2016**, at 11:30am in the Ice Center Show Ring.

Requirements:

1. Calf must be born between **April 15, 2016 and August 1, 2016**. The calf can be either a heifer or bull calf and must be a dairy calf. No animal that is shown in open class or junior fair may be used in the Farm Bureau Kiddie Showmanship event. A second calf may be entered in the event that the first calf is not show ring ready.
2. There will be four (4) classes: 4-year-old Preschool; Kindergarten; First Grade; Second Grade. **These classes are grades the children have completed in 2016.**
3. Calves must be at the fair by 10:30am on Sunday and taken home after the show due to space availability in the barns.
4. Children are not required to wear white clothing.
5. Calves do not need to be clipped.
6. Children will be required to wear a number which will be distributed prior to the show. The order of the children is preselected and will enter the ring in numerical order.
7. Children will be judged on the way they handle the calf and show basic showmanship skills.
8. If you have children in more than one age group, they may show the same calf; however, **this is discouraged because the young aged of the calf tire easily.** If you have two (2) children in the same group, they will need two (2) calves.
9. Ribbons will be awarded. There are NO cash prizes.
10. To be eligible to enter the Kiddie Showmanship event, you must complete a registration form, which is available from the Farm Bureau Office, on the Manitowoc County Expo Web site at [www.manitowoccountyexpo.com](http://www.manitowoccountyexpo.com), or at the Expo Office. Entries are due on **August 15, 2016 – Not postmarked the 15<sup>th</sup>**. **No Late Entries will be allowed.** We hope for a good turnout!
